RT is an affiliate of the Australian Reconciliation Network, and aims to foster reconciliation with Australia's first peoples with education programmes and corporate engagement through Reconciliation Action Plans.


Julian read the *Uluru Statement from the Heart*, which calls for a First People's voice to Australia's state and federal parliaments, telling the truth of our history, and a treaty to enable all Australians to move forward celebrating the culture and learning of 60,000 years of occupation of our land.
